NDAA Update

As I write this month's legislative update, the government continues to operate under a Continuing Resolution until November 21st with no Congressional agreement on the 2020 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).

Sen. Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) introduced a "skinny NDAA" Oct. 29 to ensure essential defense programs continue uninterrupted.

While the new, \$738 billion bill authorizes next year's 3.1% military pay raise, extends bonus and incentive pays, provides for quality-of-life programs for military families, and includes funding for military construction and acquisition programs, <u>it leaves out several MOAA-supported issues that are addressed in either the House or Senate NDAA versions, or in both.</u> This includes language that would:

- Prevent the elimination of 18,000 military medical billets.
- End the "widows tax."
- Require comprehensive military housing reform.
- Stop changes and consolidations planned for the commissary and exchange system.
- Fund necessary improvements to military spouse employment and education resources. military spouse employment and education resources.

Inhofe said he introduced a skinny NDAA "to preserve all options" to continue Congress's 58-year streak of passing an annual defense bill.

Other items of Interest

Open Season for FEDVIP

Open season for the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Program (FEDVIP) runs through Dec. 9. If you're eligible for FEDVIP this marks the one time you can change your 2020 coverage without undergoing a qualifying life event.

Remember: If you want to keep the plan you're on, no action is required during open season.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE CONTINUED

2020 Medicare Part B Premium

The standard Medicare Part B premium will rise about \$9 a month beginning Jan. 1, 2020, but beneficiaries in higher income brackets will see a larger increase.

Individuals whose 2018 modified adjusted gross income (MAGI), as reported on their federal tax return, was \$87,000 or less, or was \$174,000 in a joint return, will pay \$144.60 a month in premium costs, up from \$135.50 in 2019.

Beneficiaries in five higher income brackets pay an extra charge, known as an Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA), which also goes up at the start of the new year:

- If your individual tax income was above \$87,000 to \$109,000, or your joint income was above \$174,000 up to \$218,000, you'll pay **\$202.40 per month**.
- From \$109,000 to \$136,000 individual or \$218,000 to \$272,000 joint, you'll pay **\$289.20 per month**.
- From \$136,000 to \$163,000 individual or \$272,000 to \$326,000 joint, you'll pay **\$376 per month.**
- From \$163,000 to \$500,000 individual or \$326,000 to \$750,000 joint, you'll pay **\$462.70 per month.** If you are married but file a separate tax return with income above \$87,000 but less than \$413,000, you'll also pay this rate.
- Above \$500,000 individual or above \$750,000 joint, you'll pay **\$491.60 per month.** If you are married but file a separate tax return with income above \$413,000, you'll also pay this rate.

After the loss of my husband, that first set of holidays was a whirlwind. My blended family came around with little planning, as they made sure I wasn't alone or sad. They were grieving too, and it seemed natural to be together.

The years since that first set of holidays after my husband's death have not been as traditional. I'm ready to set a new tradition, but I find it difficult because the circumstances in my life have changed, as has my growing and changing family.

Last year, all the kids decided to coordinate spending every other year with their in-laws, and so it was the first year that I would have to find another way to spend Christmas without them. My sister invited me to spend Christmas Eve and day with her and her husband and her two grown kids. I accepted, but I had not expected it to be much fun.

It turned out to be one of the best times I'd had in years. We opened presents one by one, and it literally took six hours! It reminded me of the way my sister and I opened presents in our family when we were kids. Our dad always examined every gift and made a big deal out of the smallest things.

I left her house with a new perspective. I will try to keep an open mind about the holidays and remind myself the following:

- I am not alone.
- I'm thankful for even the smallest things
- I know there are people who care and want to help. I need to learn to accept help.
- I try not to worry or let fear take over. It's usually a waste of time.
- It becomes more evident that everyone who I have crossed paths with has been there for a reason.

As I move into the 2019 holiday season, I know there will be some struggles, but there also will be joys along the way.
