CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Zig Ziglar wrote a little piece about BEING A DIFFERENCE. I think it is worth reading! Most people are familiar with the fact that on October 8, 1871, fire broke out in Chicago and claimed more than 200 lives and destroyed more than 7,000 buildings. But many people do not realize that on the same day, fire broke out in Peshtigo, Wisconsin. That blaze claimed an estimated 1,500 lives and scorched 1.28 million acres of timberland. The news media of the day were centered in and around Chicago, whereas Peshtigo was small and off the beaten path. Consequently, the attention was minimal. But I think all of us would agree that the Peshtigo fire was significant. Because it didn't get the publicity, however, very few people are aware of it today.

That's the way it frequently is in life... Literally thousands of people are doing significant things every day to help a neighbor, a homeless individual, or those who do not have fuel to heat their homes or food for their tables. These silent angels of mercy do these things because they want to do them and because they believe they are their brothers' keepers. The joy and satisfaction of doing something with no thought of recognition, reward, or return are all the pay these unsung heroes want. They do their good deeds for unselfish reasons.

Caring for those who care for veterans

November was National Family Caregivers Month. There are over 14 million military and non-traditional veteran caregivers in the U.S., representing 5.5 percent of the adult population. Most of the veterans they care for have a chronic condition and/or vision/hearing impairment, and 40 percent have a diagnosed mental health condition or substance use disorder (compared with 24 percent of civilian care recipients).

Across all caregivers, 80% spend up to 30 hours per week providing care. Military/veteran caregivers provide services valued at a minimum of \$119 billion, but they spend approximately \$8,500 in out-of-pocket expenses because of their caregiving, forgo \$4,522 in earnings, and are mostly not accessing benefits that they are likely entitled to receive. A greater proportion of military/veteran caregivers who provide most care remotely met criteria for excessive burden, high stress, and depression, compared with those who provide most care in person.

The authors of the recent RAND report, *America's Military and Veteran Caregivers: Hidden Heroes Emerging from the Shadows*, found that only approximately two-thirds of military/veteran caregivers felt that health care providers did not seek their input or listen to them about the care recipient. Also, one-third of military/veteran caregivers reported experiencing hassles in health care, such as having to remind staff to do things for the care recipient or experiencing delays in completing paperwork.

Elizabeth Dole Home- and Community-Based Services for Veterans and Caregivers Act

The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act (H.R. 8371) sits stalled in the House, with no corresponding bill in the Senate. On December 5, 2023, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the Elizabeth Dole Home- and Community-Based Services for Veterans and Caregivers Act (H.R. 542, 2023). This proposed legislation would expand home and community-based care services to veterans, including raising the cap on how much VA can pay to cover home care costs. It would also provide additional respite services to caregivers of veterans receiving VA home care programs.

Help MOAA drive Congress to take decisive action. <u>Reach out to your lawmakers</u> today and urge them to pass the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act.

The Poinsettia

Poinsettia is a commercially important flowering plant species of the diverse spurge family Euphorbiaceae. Indigenous to Mexico and Central America, the poinsettia was first described by Europeans in 1834. It is particularly well known for its red and green foliage and is widely used in Christmas floral displays. It derives its common English name from Joel Roberts Poinsett, the first United States minister to Mexico who is credited with introducing the plant to the United States in the 1820's. Poinsettias are shrubs or small trees with heights of 0.6 to 4 meters (2.0 to 13.1 feet). Though often stated to be toxic, poinsettia is not dangerous to pets or children. Exposure to the plant, even consumption, most often results in nausea, vomiting or diarrhea. They became associated with the Christmas holiday and are popular seasonal decorations. Every year in the US, approximately 70 million poinsettias are sold within a six-week period.

I want to share with you a poem I found entitled, "The Poinsettia". The author is unknown.

I will start today serenely With a true and noble aim;

I will give unselfish service To enrich another's name.

I will speak a word of courage To a soul enslaved by fear;

I will dissipate drab discord With the sunshine of good cheer.


